Isolation Measures

Protocol to restrict any potentially sick persons from physical contact with others.	Eagle provides child- and adult-size masks in each room (classrooms, gym, front office, etc.). There is a designated isolation space outside monitored by Eagle staff. All individuals are required to wear face coverings indoors and outdoors through March 27. On March 28, 2022, masking is optional but encouraged outdoors. On April 11, 2022, masking indoors is optional but strongly encouraged. Eagle follows OHA and CDC guidelines.	Anyone developing cough, fever, chills, shortness of breath, difficulty breathing, or sore throat while at school must be given a face covering to wear, isolated from others immediately; and sent home as soon as possible. Anyone with these symptoms must remain home until fever-free for at least 24 hours without use of fever-reducing medicine and other symptoms are improving. Individuals may be offered a COVID rapid test before returning to school to ensure they are not actively carrying COVID. Involve school nurses and school-based health centers (SBHCs) in development of protocols and assessment of symptoms, when available.

Ensure hand hygiene on entry to school every day: wash with soap and water for 20 seconds or use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with 60-95% alcohol. Hand washing is required before every meal and after restroom use.	Students are given hand sanitizer prior to entering the building each morning and at each transition point during the day. Students are required to wash their hands upon entering the classroom at the start of the day, prior to lunch, and after PE.	
Appropriate cleaning and contingency plans for routine infection prevention, and for closing school based on identified COVID-19 cases and in compliance with public health and CDC guidelines.	Classrooms are routinely disinfected at the end of each day. PE and recess equipment are sanitized regularly. Restrooms are sprayed with disinfectant after each use. Students wash their hands and then use sanitizer before returning to the classroom.	Routine cleaning and disinfecting should follow <u>CDC cleaning and</u> <u>disinfecting guidance</u> , and includes cleaning classrooms between groups, playground equipment between groups, restroom door or faucet handles, etc.
	In the event of a COVID exposure, the classroom is cleaned with disinfectant and an electrostatic cleaner.	
	All classrooms are cleaned once a week with the electrostatic cleaner regardless of exposure.	
	Supplies are located in the custodial closet and monitored by Eagle's custodian.

	On Mar 28, 2022, masking is optional but encouraged outdoors. On Apr 11, 2022, masking is optional but encouraged indoors.	
	Face coverings are provided to students and staff who need them. Eagle shares guidance and information about the proper use of face coverings with parents.
